

PHLEBOTOMY TECHNICIAN

James Sprunt Community College's allied health program will be offering training to prepare a student seeking to become a Certified Phlebotomy Technicians (CPT). This is a certificate program. Upon successful completion of this program the student will receive a certificate of completion and be eligible to apply for a national certification exam given by a nationally



recognized CPT certification board such as the National Phlebotomy Association (NPA). Phlebotomy is a career with a faster than average growth expectancy. Phlebotomy Training here at James Sprunt

Community College prepares the student to draw blood specimens from patients for the purpose of testing and analyzing blood.

A phlebotomist's job includes:

- maintenance of equipment used in obtaining blood specimens
- the use of appropriate communication skills when working with patients
- the selection of venipuncture sites
- the care of blood specimens; the entry of the testing process into a computer
- clerical duties associated with record keeping of the blood tests

Prerequisites class: CRC with score of bronze, completed HRD program,

Prerequisites clinical: immunizations, flu, TD, and TB skin test, background check and drug screen.

On registration day or pre-registration (recommended) bring:

1. a photo ID,
2. your social security card,
3. background check and drug screen (call to get details),
4. proof of CRC score- at least a bronze- or valid health care certificate (NA, etc.),
5. immunization records, and
6. all money for tuition and insurances.
